Staying Hydrated

It's incredibly important to stay hydrated throughout the school day but...

DID YOU KNOW? As well as causing tooth decay, squash drinks can cause a type of tooth wear called acid erosion. Most fruit flavoured drinks are acidic and so can soften the enamel and dentine in teeth so that they wear away.

It is better to drink a whole glass of squash with a meal, rather than sipping throughout the day, which is why we only encourage water in water bottles for use during the school day.

Tremains Rangers




